EYFS – Early Years Foundation Stage - Nursery

This half term has been a busy one in Acorns Nursery.

We have celebrated St. George's Day making hats and flags. We focused our learning on London, where we looked at maps and landmarks. We made a great big London bus with the big wooden blocks outside. We thought about spring, sharing the story 'When will it be spring?', then we went on a spring walk with binoculars to find signs of spring. We have learnt about the frog life-cycle. We did some frog yoga and explored rhyming, sharing the story 'Oi Frog'.

We celebrated the King's coronation, thinking about the royal family and our family. We made a big throne in our reading area and had a crown and a sceptre to dress up like the King. We had a very exciting delivery of tiny caterpillars to our classroom for our learning on the butterfly life cycle. They have been eating and eating and are very big caterpillars now. We can't wait for them to turn into butterflies. We have also welcomed some new friends to Acorns Nursery too.





EYFS – Early Years Foundation Stage - Reception

During the summer half term, Oaks Reception Class has been actively engaged in learning about the fascinating topic of new life. The children have eagerly absorbed new information, expanding both their vocabulary and knowledge. We focused on lifecycle of caterpillars. The children had the opportunity to witness this magical process first-hand as they nurtured and cared for five caterpillars, observing them grow and develop into beautiful butterflies, which we later released and watched them fly away.

The sunny weather provided an excellent opportunity for the children to explore and have fun outside. They embarked on a "learning hunt" within the school grounds, discovering and observing various seeds and learning about how plants grow. This hands-on approach allowed the children to develop a deeper understanding of nature and the natural world around them. Furthermore, the Reception class actively participated in planting their own seeds, fostering a sense of responsibility and connection to the environment.



Overall, the summer half term for the Reception class was an enriching and exciting period of exploration and discovery.





<u>Key Stage One – Year One</u>

This half term Willow Class has been learning all about materials! We have enjoyed lots of opportunities for practical learning while investigating materials and which are best for different purposes. Our Maths on measure and multiplication has also lent itself to a lot of practical activities which has seen the children work on their collaboration and independence skills. We have loved learning about the Creation story in RE and thinking about how beautiful our world is and how we can help look after it. Year 1 have been particularly interested in looking at what other countries' weather and terrain is like. We are excited for opportunities to continue to take our learning outside next half term as the weather improves!



<u> Key Stage One – Year Two</u>

In Holly Class this half term we have been learning about the Great Fire of London. We started the half term by baking bread rolls because it is believed that the fire started in a bakery on Pudding Lane in London. The children were intrigued by the fact that you can still visit Pudding Lane today and that the monument built to remember the fire and celebrate the rebuilding of the city, if laid flat, will reach the place in Pudding Lane where the fire started. Our favourite fact has been that Samuel Pepys buried his most valuable possessions (cheese and wine) to protect them from the spreading flames.

Our other highlights have been playing trust games in Jigsaw and all of the Coronation celebrations.



Key Stage Two – Year Three

In Hawthorn Class this half term, our 'Buzz Off!' unit has given us lots of opportunities to get outside and experience the natural world and the changes that happen at this time of year. In the classroom we have learnt about the life cycle of flowering plants and have read different excerpts from 'The Secret Garden' in order to write our own setting description. We also got the chance to decorate our own sunflower pots with a stencil design which are now at home with sunflower seeds (hopefully!) germinating in the soil. During our visits to the wild area at the back of the field, we have been able to discuss the best ways to describe that sort of environment in our writing, and have also had a go at observing the landscape in order to draw it in our sketch books.







<u>Key Stage Two – Year Four</u>

As always, this half term seems to have flown by in Maple Class.

It started with Bikeability in the first few days back. The children loved practicing their skills and beginning to think about how they can make sure their bikes are safe.

Over the term, our theme has been rainforests. We've enjoyed finding out about the different layers and types of wildlife you could find in each. We've also thought about why rainforests are being destroyed and the effect it has. Alongside this, we have looked at some of the work of Henri Rousseau and tried to create our own pictures based on his works. Finally, in science, we've been thinking about states of matter and explored the properties of solids, liquids and gases.

We had a great day celebrating the Coronation. We spent time finding out about some of the regalia the King was presented with, exploring the meaning of some of the pieces and the history of them. We also really enjoyed the celebration lunch together!



<u> Key Stage Two – Year Five</u>

Of course, the highlight for Sycamore Class this half term was our trip to High Ashurst!

The children really shone and loved experiencing the outdoor environment for a few days. They completed a range of activities such as rock climbing, high ropes, woodland skills and code breaking. The children particularly enjoyed having 'free time' to play with their friends and explore the woods around them! They were resilient, worked hard and showed positive and supportive encouragement for each other. Year 5 should be really proud of themselves.









<u>Key Stage Two – Year Six</u>

It has been a very busy and successful half-term in Year 6! The children showed fantastic determination, resilience and perseverance during SATs week, and everyone tried their best and gave it their all. To celebrate their achievements, the whole school created a human tunnel on the field for Year 6 to run under! Well done Ash Class!

Our topic this half-term has been 'The Golden Age of Islam'. We have been reading, sequencing and discussing themes of traditional tales from 'One Thousand and One Arabian Nights'. The class then did an incredible job at writing their own tales, which were inspired by the book. They then wrote their tales up neatly and we published them a book, which we called 'The Last 26 Arabian Nights.' We have also been learning about the importance of Baghdad during the Early Islamic Civilisation, and how advanced the city was in comparison to Europe at the time.

ROAD SAFETY

I have been looking at how we use the entrances and exits and I would like to re-establish some expectations in order to keep all children and adults safe.

No parents to use the staff car park unless given permission by the Head - this applies to all times in the day.

If you are dropping off to breakfast club before 8am or picking up from Camp glide after 5pm you may use the staff car park but only park in a **parking bay** – not behind other cars or on the access road.

All children and adults to use the footpaths during drop off and pick up.



I know that this adds on a couple of minutes and is a bit further to walk but we really do need to be aware of where it is appropriate to walk and where it is not – this ensures that children receive clear messages about road safety.



When parking on the surrounding roads by school please do not park on double yellow lines – <u>they are there for a reason.</u>

Double yellow lines are outside of the school



to ensure that all cars and pedestrians have a clear sight of the road in both directions from the school gates – this is a safety and safeguarding matter.

Serious concerns have been raised about the safety of children due to careless parking and driving, resulting in near misses – I urge you all to take

this matter seriously to prevent any harm befalling one of our children.
