# VIP (Very important parent) lunch – Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June

Once you have had lunch with your child please say goodbye in the hall so that they can make their way outside to play – parents will not be permitted to go outside with them. This is a safeguarding matter.

We will not be adding to current lists of attending parents.

When we repeat this event we will strictly adhere to the deadline of when to book.

#### **Vison and Values**

We are developing our values to ensure all that we do here at Trinity Oaks has a biblically based theologically-rooted Christian Vision.

Mr Stockwell, who is our Christian distinctiveness leader, myself, the staff and Governors have been thinking about our core values and how we would like to see our lived Christian distinctiveness embedded into school life and curriculum.

This is our first draft, that our children's faith group have discussed, for you to take a look at – we would introduce our new vision, mission and values at the beginning of the new academic year.

Vision: Where acorns flourish into oaks. (Isaiah 61:3 – They will be oaks of righteousness)

Mission: Rooted in God's love and Christian values, we are a school who treasure each individual, enabling them to flourish and achieve.

Values Statement:

We are **thankful** for the uniqueness of everyone in our community, created in God's image, fostering relationships with integrity rooted in God's love. We value and **respect** all people in our community. Our pupils, staff and families work together with **kindness** and **compassion**. to support each other. We are **resilient** learners who recognise that perseverance and risk-taking is the key to our success.

**Respectful** – interactions with others (Matthew 7:12)

Kind – displaying integrity towards others (Galatians 5:22-23)

Compassionate – interactions with the world around us and the community in which we live (Ephesians 4:32)

Thankful – being grateful for what we have the privileges that we are afforded (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

Resilient – risk takers, perseverance (Philippians 4:13)

Call to Worship: 'Jesus light of the world is here. Lord Jesus shine on us.'

Class names will be changed to trees in the Bible passages. This will help to underpin our values and give each class an identity.

Year 6 - Oak (Isaiah 61:3)
